FISHERS GREEN CONSORTIUM

The Club will again be purchasing a **limited supply** of Consortium tickets, and these will be sold to members on a first come, first served basis at £10 per person in addition to their normal subscription. This year members can pay for their ticket on their renewal form in the appropriate box.

Please note this is not a BDAC venue so it is policed by FGC bailiffs and any disciplinary matters are handled by the Consortium only.

GUEST DAY PASSES

These are only available for the Club's freehold waters **Southminster, Asheldham and Straits Mill, Braintree**. To apply phone the Club's Helpline (giving at least 24 hours notice) to book and ensure that a guest pass is available for a certain date (during busy times their issue may be restricted).

Fee:

Day passes (6am to 10pm) £10 per guest.

Two day pass at Southminster only (6am on day 1 to 10pm on day 2) £18 per guest.

Payment can only be made by bank transfer to BDAC sort code 20-37-83 account number 90158224 with the member's name being the reference.

Rules:

The pass must be taken with the guest on the day.

These passes are non-transferable and non-refundable.

The member must be responsible for the guest adhering to the Club's bylaws and venue's rules.

All guests must be accompanied by the fully paid up member.

WATER SHARE WITH BISHOPS STORTFORD & DISTRICT ANGLING SOCIETY (BSDAS)

The Club has again agreed with BSDAS for a water share arrangement. 100 BSDAS members will again be able to fish our water at Straits Mill, Braintree (both lakes and river), and 100 of our members will be able to fish their water "Malcolm Barker Lake" and a short stretch of the River Stort. Full details of these fisheries including directions can be viewed on www.bsdas.org.uk. Only the following classes of members of this Club will be eligible; Ordinary, OAP, Disabled and Intermediate. This will be on a strictly first come first served basis and successful applicants will receive a BSDAS card in May and will be valid from 1st June 2018. Last year this was over-subscribed and the Club understands a number of these tickets were not used. This year please only apply if you are going to use the ticket on a regular basis so those members who live nearby and would like to fish this venue will stand a chance of getting a ticket. Also last year some members were not able to get a ticket because they did not send in a SAE envelope and their envelope was too small.

The BSDAS card will show the gate padlock combination for Malcom Barker Lake for the 10 month period together with their club rules and directions relating to the lake and river. Complete the application form on **page 10** and return, together with a **C5 Stamped addressed envelope**, with your completed renewal form.

IMPORTANT—MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

NO MEMBERSHIPS WILL BE SENT OUT UNTIL 21ST MARCH (AFTER THE CLUB'S AGM)

Write your name on the reverse of your photo and **sign your cheque** (if used). To help process and speed up your renewal the Club would prefer payment to be made by bank transfer either through internet banking or by paying at a Barclays Bank branch. Ensure that your name and ID number (see renewal form) is sent as the reference so that the Club knows who the money is coming from and don't forget to send in your completed renewal form and photo. Note that this year the Club's bank account sort code has changed to 20-37-83, the account number remains 90158224. Any new non-fishing member will require a separate form available from our website or via the Club's Helpline.

This year we have included boxes for the night fishing fees and Fishers Green Consortium. To avoid changing your membership card during the season and incurring an admin. fee, make sure that you include these additional fees with your renewal subscription.

Memberships will be processed in the order they are received but cheques will take at least a week to clear. You have until **30th April** to renew after that a £10 entry fee will be charged as your membership will have deemed to have elapsed. If you wish to fish from **1st May** you must ensure that your renewal form is received by the membership dept. by **7th April** to guarantee your membership card will be back in time.

Memberships are only issued by post. No photos are required for Associates or Juniors.

Any Junior becoming an Intermediate must fill out their details in the Junior box and include a photo. Disabled members **must** send the required proof showing current eligibility, any member who does not send this will have their application returned. Please provide either phone numbers or preferably an email address in order that we can contact you if there are any problems with your renewal and to help the Club keep you up to date with any urgent news.

FISHERY REPORTS

STRAITS MILL, BRAINTREE

The year at Straits Mill:

Numbers were up on previous years, with the small lake proving the most popular after the introduction of a second lot of Tench, these are now showing in most catches along with the Bream, regular bags around 40lb with some topping 60lb. We will continue to remove the Pike and carp from this lake, and put them into the big lake. The big Lake fishes well for the Carp in the summer and we seem to have a good head of fish around the 10 to 18 lb range. These fish are putting on weight at a fair pace and I hope to see these fish into the 20s in the near future, some anglers are catching 5 to 7 fish in a day, but it is a lake you have to get to know where the fish are and how they behave under particular conditions. Bream to 6lb and Roach 1lb 10oz along with loads of Rudd to 1lb 8oz, have been banked.

The Pike are well fed, due to huge shoals of silver fish, making this one of our best Pike waters, with the number of members fishing for them all year around.

Lots of work has taken place at Straits this year. The reinstatement of the overflow pond by the Essex Wildlife trust and the EA being one of them. The other large job was the removal of around 40 large trees most of these were cricket bat willows, with a few rotting and dangerous trees. These have now all been replanted with more cricket bat willows.

HENNY STREET RIVER STOUR

On the Stour this summer the dry weather has not helped the fishing, that said the clear water has favoured the hemp and tare approach for roach which do seem to be making a bit of a come back along the whole of the middle Stour. Fingers crossed this will continue. Early Autumn was also dry and cold so the chub fishing has started very late. In between the high water and on the fine down a few specimen fish to 5lb 13oz have been caught so far. This sums up the Stour as fishing a day too early or catch it too late and you can all too easily miss the good fishing. Enjoy the rest of the season (as its the best time - in my opinion) but also take care as the banks are slippery in places.

Of course like every fishery there is the odd one who thinks the rules apply to others and not to them. Such members are infrequent and have been dealt with by the Club. Just as a reminder, Should any member catch a catfish, it must not be returned to the lake. You must inform a BDAC Officer and the fish placed in the cage provided at the water. **It is illegal to introduce catfish or any non indigenous species to any water.**

I would also like to remind members of the 72 hour rule that applies to Barleylands. There is more information on this contained in the newsletter.

With that I would like to thank all my bailiffs for their hard work and hope to see you all on the bank again next season. Until then, tight lines.

FISHERY REPORTS

RIVER RODING

Its been an indifferent year on the river this year, with some good fish coming out just before the end of the last season. Then there was a very dry cold spring which saw the water level drop and the fish spawned late May. The river level at Mitchells Farm right through to the end of section at Stanford Rivers remained the lowest I have ever experienced since becoming fishery officer right though to December. The only plus side was I was able to cut 5 new swims in from Mitchells. There have been several large trees which have gone across noted swims at Stanford Rivers and need contractors to pull them out and this section would have great potential. Despite all this I have had the pleasure of putting members who have turned up onto good swims where they have been impressed with the size and quality of the fish they have caught. One member reported three Chub from two swims fished between 4 and 5 pounds along with a 14 ounce Roach. It made a difference that the new owner of Mitchells farm allowed me to drive up the track and park outside the swims I was working on. Its a pity there is no track along Stanford Rivers, because it is back breaking work even to get tools to the swims to keep them open. Patch Park has been un-fishable all year and apart from the kids and picnickers playing in the Brook I have not seen anyone fishing it on my visits there. Its my last year as Fishery Officer and its been a pleasure meeting members and giving any advise I could to catch them more fish. I hope the future incoming Officer enjoys this great little River, half as much as I have.

RIVER WID

I am glad to report that over the last year I have seen an increase in the number of members fishing this delightful stretch of Essex River. I am also glad to report that the Environment Agency have recently stocked our stretch of this river with 3 year old chub and dace. This should reflect well for future fishing. Catch returns for 2017 include chub to 3lbs+, large dace, roach, rudd. A 7lb carp, eels, small pike, brown trout and gudgeon. A small crucian carp and a small tench have also been landed. I advise a mobile travel light approach either on the float – if the water is flowing and coloured or on the link ledger/small feeder – when the water is low and clear. Catch three or

four fish from each swim then move on. Maggot, caster and worm work well. Other members recommend ledgering cubed luncheon meat, cheese/paste and feed hemp or mashed bread and bran. I wish to thank my bailiff Barry Stringer also my neighbour Andy for helping out on the last work party. Please forward your catch returns, observations and updates together with availability for the next work party weekend - Saturday 9th/ Sunday 10th June 2018.

HICKS FARM

I have really enjoyed my first year as fishery officer and meeting the many knowledgeable anglers who have fished at the lake. Most importantly, this venue has a really good head of fish in it. There are carp ranging from 1lb to close to 20lbs and for those who like silver fishing, there are plenty of roach, rudd, gudgeon, perch and also some tench and bream. This fishery is probably the best for taking young children to as they will catch fish of all sizes in the summer months and by various methods. Pole fishing and feeder fishing are really popular here, but I find margin fishing late afternoon in the summer months, can give some really great sport. Hicks Farm is also a popular match fishing venue where winning weights are often 100lbs plus and because of this you should always check your handbook to check when the venue is free. As a rough guide, most matches are often held on Wednesdays and Sundays although on the odd weekend, it is closed by the owner to allow the caravan club to enjoy the venue. Those of you, who know this fishery, will be pleased to know we have at last been able to expand the bottom car park. During our close season (April 2018), we will be repairing a number of swims on the field side of the fishery and I will be placing "chicken" wire over the wooden platforms as they can become slippery particularly during the colder months. Please check the notice board during the season and remember to close and lock the gate each time you enter and leave the venue. Enjoy!

DODDS FARM

This report only up until middle of August as I only looked after lakes for 5 months. First I would thank everyone that turned up for work parties during the close season enabling all swims to be fishable and thanks for those that helped during the months following. Fishing was very good in both lakes, with many fish being caught. Carp in excess of 20lb. Tench to 5.1/2lb. Good size Roach and Perch were also caught on a regular basis and the lakes were well attended throughout the months leading up to end of August. As summer progressed the water level fell quite low and weed growth ruined a lot of swims along with the lily pads and bank side vegetation becoming overgrown. Lack of rain made the fishing much harder and on some days only a few fish were landed. Almost every angler cleared their swim so litter was not a problem this year. However a number of anglers were warned for not having a rod licence with them and for using floating baits. I had to ask 2 anglers to leave due to not having a unhooking mats when carp fishing. One thing that I asked for was that a suitable landing be used for the large fish on these lakes. Many anglers turned up with tiny nets for roach or perch and then could not land large carp.

Good luck for all anglers fishing these specimen waters.

SENIOR SECTION END OF SEASON MATCH REPORT 2017/18

With 20 league matches fitted into the season, first was at Rayne Lodge. Chris Ward would go on to win this match with 104lb 8oz, also taking 3 more wins during the season. Match 2 Committee Cup, Mick Brown would make his first appearance of the season one of only a handful of appearances. Mick Brown won with 77lb 6oz. Match 3, Tylers Common (Horseshoe). Ray Ankin won this with 109lb 2oz. Match 4, Monks Lake 1, only 6lb 12oz would separate the top 4. Winner Ray Strutt, with 106lb 12oz. Match 5 Churchgate Lakes, Mick Brown won - 222lb 4oz, 2nd place was a huge 135lb behind Mick. Match 6, Windmill Lakes, Mick Brown won with 38lb 2oz. Match 7 Colemans, (Wood), Ben Bray won with 139lbs 8oz. Match 8 Hicks Farm won by Shaun Mahoney, 128lb 10oz . Match 9, Southminster, winner Ray Ankin with 126lb 4oz. Match 10 Puddledock, winner, Len Goulding with 115lb. Match 11 Hicks Farm, winner Mick Brown with 105lb. Match 12, Orchard Farm. Only 15 turned up but what a days fishing. Winner on the day Shaun Mahoney 198lb. The total weight caught between 15 anglers was 1563lb 8os. Match 13, Monks Lake, winner Tony Eustace 113lb. NEW NIGHT FISHING FEES

Laundry Lake

After some tough negotiation with the owners of Laundry Lake, they have agreed to allow night fishing on a one season's trial basis from 1st May 2018. Their concerns are about litter which may be left by members who spend longer periods at the water. Our team stressed that with night fishing the water would be policed 24 hours a day as there have been reports in the past of non-members on the water overnight. It will be up to members to ensure there is no litter or excess noise or the Club will lose this concession (possibly before the end of the season's trial). To avoid overcrowding and to protect the welfare of the fish the Club has decided to charge a fee for the night fishing (9.00pm to 6.00am). Only members who pay the extra fee will be allowed on this water during these hours.

Barleylands

The Club has for several years been concerned about the pressure of overcrowding and the welfare of the fish stocks at this water. The Club has therefore decided to introduce a charge for night fishing at this water to try to ease the pressure. From the 1st May 2018 a fee will be payable for those members who wish to fish between 9.00pm and 6.00am. Only members who pay this extra fee will be allowed on this water during these hours.

Members who wish to night fish both these waters can purchase a joint night fishing permit at a discounted fee.

For both of these waters the Club has decided to introduce a bylaw saying that members can spend **no more than 72 hours on the fishery then no return to that fishery for 48 hours.** All new fees will be shown on your application form.

DODDS FARM

Ensure that you read your 2018/19 handbook for new relaxed rules on use of baits at Dodds Farm.

RECTORY PONDS LITTLE EASTON

The owners of Rectory Ponds have agreed to clear away overgrown banks and remove silt from the top lake in April 2018.

SHALFORD CHURCH LAKES

Work to clear excess undergrowth, unblock feeder pipes and repair and improve swims is continuing through January to March 2018. Both lakes will be closed whilst the works are in progress.

RIVER PANT

The Club will be giving up the upper section of the R. Pant from the Shalford road bridge down stream to the fence at Shalford Church at the end of the current season.

KEEP NETS

Due to an outbreak of Koi Herpes Virus (KHV), keep nets are prohibited on all BDAC waters until further notice. The exception being for official Club matches. See the website for further information on this issue when available.
